Friends of the San Antonio Public Library Board Meeting Minutes

Sunday, November 21, 2021 | Pan American Library

Call to Order: **John Costello**, President of the Friends of the San Antonio Public Library, called the meeting to order at 2:01 p.m.

Roll Call: President Costello called the roll. The following members were present: **Elena Brickman, Monica Brite, Kim Cauthon, Barbara Chavez, John Costello, Nancy Gandara, Beth Graham, Barbara Morrow, Pat Mendiola, Napoleon "Eddie" Patino, Veronica Rouse,** and **Jill Zimmerman**. A quorum was declared.

In the absence of Secretary Pedersen, **Eddie Patino** took minutes.

Approval of the Minutes: President Costello asked if there were any corrections to the Minutes from the September Board meeting. **Eddie Patino** moved to approve the minutes with the following amendment to clarify the last paragraph under Old Business: "After discussion, it was noted the Friends groups must follow the appropriate fiscal procedures to avoid paying sales tax." **Veronica Rouse** seconded this motion. The motion passed unanimously, and the minutes were approved as amended.

President's Report: President Costello attended a Library Bond meeting, the Arts & Letters Awards, and the San Antonio Public Library Foundation Annual Meeting. President Costello urged board members to advocate for the proposed Library Bond projects. He also announced that the Friends groups for the following branches are inactive: Bazan, Collins Garden, and Texana. President Costello announced that the Annual Meeting for the Friends would be on January 23, 2022, at 2

p.m. in the auditorium of the Central Library.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer **Barbara Morrow** presented the report. Immediate Past President **Beth Graham** moved to accept the report and Vice President **Nancy Gandara** seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Liaison Reports Board of Trustees: **Jean Brady** represented the Library Board of Trustees and spoke about the proposed Library bond projects. Trustee Brady presented several talking points regarding Library advocacy and the need to start a dialog with your Council members, Trustee Brady stressed the importance of attending the Facilities Committee meetings in December to advocate for these projects.

One can also submit advocacy through the 311 system to a customer service representative, or through the City of San Antonio web page.

Library Administration: Assistant Library Director **Kathy Donellan** provided an update on the status of the Library's 2017 bond projects. McCreless branch is nearing completion and should be open mid-spring 2022, and Memorial branch is scheduled to reopen in late spring 2022. The designs for the Las Palmas branch are being finalized, and renovations will begin after Memorial reopens. As a result of the winter storm in February, Forest Hills was severely damaged and will require a complete renovation, which is expected to take up to a year. Construction will be starting on the first and third floors of Central Library immediately, with the Texana renovations to begin in late spring 2022. Another new program launched by SAPL is Digital Equity and

Inclusion, which loans out iPads to citizens over 60 years of age.

San Antonio Public Library Foundation: Executive Director **Amy Hone** was unable to attend, so President Costello reported on the success of the Foundation's Catrina Ball.

Reports

Arts and Letters Awards Committee comments were provided by committee members with a bottom line that it was well organized and very successful. Members were reminded that the 50th Arts and Letters Awards will occur in 2022.

Budget Committee 2022 report was provided by **Kim Cauthon** and Vice-President **Gandara**. Members of the committee also included Treasurer **Morrow** and **Glenna Seyfer** (Encino Branch Friends).

Nominating Committee status was provided by Immediate Past President **Graham**. Members of the committee also include **Alethea Bugg** (Tobin Branch Friends), **Monica Brite** (Carver Branch Friends), **Eiginio Rodriguez** (Memorial Branch Friends), and **Sheila Figueroa** (Landa Branch Friends).

Membership Committee: Report was presented by Secretary **Barnett**. Currently, there are 684 members, and 140 Life members. Renewal letters had been sent out and that there is a \$5,000 challenge grant for any additional gifts received before December 15, 2021.

BookCellar Report from Sue Hall was presented by Vice President **Gandara**. She provided an outstanding report with a PowerPoint set of graphs showing how many books were sold through Amazon and profits made. The

BookCellar's sales through October amounted to \$8,226. The November sales to date amounted to \$2,057. The BookCellar will have a holiday sale on the first two weekends in December.

New Business

Immediate Past President **Graham** moved to have the proposed 2022 budget adopted, and **Eddie Patino** seconded the motion. After discussion, the 2022 Budget was approved unanimously.

Monica Brite requested an additional item for discussion at our January 2022 meeting regarding support from the BookCellar for the San Antonio Little Library program. The request was approved.

Announcements

The next board meeting will be January 23, 2022, in the auditorium of the Central Library at 2:00 p.m.

Director **Patino** moved for adjournment and **Jill Zimmerman** seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 3:30 p.m.

Brook Hollow

The Brook Hollow Branch Library is now able to accept book donations. We don't know when we'll be able to hold a book sale, but we're considering holding "Pop-Up" sales – we could set up one or two tables outside, at the entrance to the Library. We might host a sale consisting primarily of fiction (we have an abundance of fiction!), or a sale focused on children's books. We're tentatively planning to host our first "Pop-Up" sale on the Saturday, Feb. 12.

Branch Manager **Jeannette Davies** and her staff have made several wreaths on their own time, using craft materials Jeannette provided. The colorful wreaths are now on display at the branch. The Brook Hollow Friends are selling holiday wreaths at affordable prices at the library to benefit library programming. As was mentioned in the November-December *SAPLings*, Jeannette also hosts "Noon Time Helping," a cooking show that utilizes the virtual programming equipment purchased by the Friends several months ago. The show not only provides entertainment and demonstrations, but also promotes the Library's book selections; during the program, viewers are told the titles of books that are available at Brook Hollow. The episode that was based on Halloween included books that referenced hauntings, various superstitions, costumes, recipes related to Halloween, etc. Similarly, the episode based on Thanksgiving provided viewers with a list of books – cook-

books and books concerning the history and traditions of Thanksgiving, etc. In addition to serving as Brook Hollow's branch manager, Jeannette is an active member of the Texas Library Association Podcast Team that received nearly 1,400 views in 2021. Jeannette was also invited by SAPL Marketing to appear on KSAT's "SA Live" on Nov. 17, where she prepared her Loco Jalapeno Cranberry Sauce.

The Friends purchased various supplies for the Teen group, including an HEB gift card (to support in-person Teen programs and provide snacks), a Shrinky Dinks Art Kit, a Sewing Kit, and modeling clay. The teens have been using the Nintendo Switch game (purchased by the Friends several months ago).

The Brook Hollow Friends held their quarterly meeting and their bi-annual election of officers Dec. 4. Our officers are **Becky Benesh**, President; **Pat Bjornson**, Vice President; **Susan Feeley**, Secretary; and **Beth Crabb**, Treasurer. All officers were elected by acclamation.

Additionally, at the Dec. 4 meeting, the Friends agreed to purchase Target gift cards for the 15 staff members, including the custodian. The Friends also agreed to provide a "Holiday Lunch" for the staff by purchasing lunches from Jimmy John's Sandwiches.

The Brook Hollow Friends will hold their next meeting on Saturday, March 12, at 11.

Regarding the proposed naming change for the Las Palmas Library: at their Oct. 27 meeting, the Public Library Board of Trustees voted to keep the name unchanged.

Library Director **Ramiro Salazar** reports that, because of unanticipated delays with the Memorial Library project, the start date for the Las Palmas Library renovation has slipped to May/June 2022. A public meeting will be held early next year to inform the community about the planned upgrades.

Election of officers for 2022-23 was held and results are:

Delia Ramirez Trimble, President; **Linda Arronge**, Vice President; **Emerald Alaniz**, Secretary; and **Vicky Enciso**, Treasurer. Congratulations to the Friends officers. Note: this is Emerald's first term on our executive board.

Significantly, the Las Palmas Branch Library and Westside Strategic Area Development project has been included for consideration in the "Facilities" category of the City's 2022-27 bond program. While the already scheduled renovation will upgrade basic structural items such as restrooms, A/C and heating systems, and a courtyard cover, the improvements in the proposed Las Palmas/Westside area design (including Las Palmas Library, the only YWCA in the city, and Las Palmas Park) will highlight existing/potential resources, eliminate environmental barriers, and provide visitors easy access to a "connected" public space. Thanks to Friends who

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advocated on behalf of all the proposed library projects.

Our group provided supplies for some of the holiday events at the library that included activities for all ages. We also hosted a luncheon for staff and presented a gift for each (including teen volunteers).
