I'm also excited to share highlights of what San Antonio Public Library (SAPL) has planned for these upcoming months.

September 15 through October 15 marks Hispanic Heritage Month each year. During this observance, SAPL will host a selection of specialized events and programs to celebrate the cultural heritage of Hispanic and Latino communities. Friends of the San Antonio Public Library Minutes

Sunday, July 17, 2022 • Igo Library • 2 p.m.

Call to Order: President **John Costello** called the meeting to order.

Roll Call: **Karin Pedersen**, Secretary, announced that a quorum was present. Board members in attendance were **Ann Springer**, **Barbara Chavez**, **Betty Walters**, **Don and Julia Castellano-Hoyt**, **Jill Zimmerman**, **Kathy Bee**, **Linda Cheatum**, **Eddie Patino**, **Pat Mendiola**, **Paula Allen**, **Sandra Wilkinson**, **Tony Moore**, and **Josie Martinez**.

Approval of Minutes of May 22, 2022: as printed in the July/Aug 2022 issue of *SAPLings* was moved by **Beth Graham** and seconded by **Betty Walters**, with unanimous approval by the board.

President's Report: **John Costello** noted that the libraries had been very busy with Summer Reading programs, which were frequently augmented by branch Friends group funds. The proposed budget for FY2022-23 is very positive for the Library, but he urged Friends Board members to contact their councilpersons in support of it. The President also called for volunteers to serve on the committee to propose the FOSAPL budget for 2023, and **Eddie Patino** and **Linda Cheatum** volunteered. He announced that **Corie Taylor** had agreed to serve as Membership Secretary, and he thanked **Barbara Morrow** for having served as Interim for the past several months.

Treasurer's Report: **Barbara Morrow** presented the Treasurer's Report and Branch Balances Report. As of June 30, 2022, the Branch Designated Funds were \$142,679.80 and the Net Assets available for FOSAPL

(for operating and Library Support to SAPL) were \$113,349.51.

Liaison Reports

Board of Trustees: **Josie Martinez** and **Marcie Ince** reported that the priorities for next year's budget request include an increase of \$1 million in the materials budget and funding for outreach to underserved areas. The next Board of Trustees' meeting will be on July 24.

San Antonio Public Library Foundation: In the absence of a representative, **John Costello** announced that the Catrina Ball will be held in person on Oct. 22 at the Central Library.

Library Administration: **Jessica Zurita** noted that work on next year's City budget is ongoing and that funds have been identified to engage a consultant who will benchmark attributes of FOSAPL versus comparable cities' Friends groups. **John Costello** and **Nancy Gandara** will be actively involved in the project.

BookCellar: **Pearl Banks** announced that despite construction on Soledad Street, both revenues and donations of materials (including from the estate of Henry B. Gonzalez) have been positive. There are currently 20 regular volunteers, seven of whom started recently. **Linda Cheatum** noted that revenue for June exceeded \$7,200, and a recent donation of 140 boxes of materials included three thousand compact discs.

Online Sales: **Ilhiana Poor** noted that YTD revenue from online sales exceeded \$10,500. Increased efforts to photograph items for sale are expected to

improve sales and reduce returns of items.

New Business

Authorization of the members of the Nominating Committee for 2023: Nominated to serve on the Nominating Committee for Officers and Board Members were: **Liz Alves**, **Pat Mendiola**, **Delia Trimble**, **Terry Ybanez**, and **Beth Graham (chair)**. **Katie Ferrier** moved to accept the slate of nominees, and **Betty Walters** seconded the motion, which passed without opposition.

Authorization of the members of the Arts & Letters Committee for 2023: Nominated to serve on the Arts & Letters Committee were: **Beth Graham**, **Emerson Stuckart**, **Anne Hohenberger**, **Beth Lowell**, **Marcie Anguiano**, and **Kim Cauthon (chair)**. **Nancy Gandara** moved to accept the slate of nominees, and **Eddie Patino** seconded the motion, which passed without opposition.

Authorization of the reactivation of the Friends of the Cortez Branch, with Bylaws of the group to be considered on Sept. 18, 2022: **Nancy Gandara** made the motion to approve, and **Eddie Patino** seconded her motion. In discussion, **Vicente Escobedo**, President of the Cortez Friends, noted that the 12 current members of the group had elected officers and would review the bylaws that had been used by the prior group. All members of the FOSAPL board were in favor of the motion as presented.

Announcements

Training sessions for branch group officers will be held in

September and will include use of a QR code with the Square to allow for non-cash sales from book carts. Questions and suggestions of issues to be covered may be sent to **Barbara Morrow** and **Nancy Gandara**.

John Costello expressed appreciation for the meeting refreshments provided by the Friends of the Igo Branch.

Adjournment

A motion to adjourn was proposed by **Pat Mendiola**, seconded by **Beth Graham**, and unanimously approved.
