

# FOSAPL & SAPL Partnership Project Update

We were pleased to be invited to the recent FOSAPL Board meeting on March 26. It was wonderful to meet many of you in person last month at the Westfall Library! At the meeting, we shared the results from the activities we have completed.

Here's what we've learned so far. Library managers and Friends agree that the FOSAPL is an important part of SAPL. Local library staff and volunteers reported that the working partnership between the two organizations is strongest at the local branch level. Library staff rely on and appreciate the flexibility that funds raised by the Friends can be used to support programming and the purchase of supplies (such as those used for arts & crafts programs) and small equipment. Both groups stated that they wish that the process for spending the money could be streamlined.

Library managers appreciate that the Friends provide insight into local community issues and greater local visibility for the SAPL. Both also agree that the Friends serve as an important conduit to the local community for Library administration.

During the Board meeting, attendees broke into small groups and were asked to prioritize issues that impact the relationship (positively or negatively) between the Friends and SAPL. Groups identified the following issues that deserve to be worked on further: communication, promotion/publicity, staff engagement, and volunteer recruitment (including succession planning).

My team and I are now in the process of interviewing a handful of outside Friends groups and a San Antonio-based nonprofit to help us learn more about their structure, operations, and relationship with the organizations they support. We are scheduled to return to San Antonio in early May to present our preliminary recommendations to the project steering committee that consists of the FOSAPL board, library trustees, and library managers.

On April 19, during its conference in Austin, The Texas Library Association, celebrating its first 100 years, paid homage to 100 "giants" who have made significant contributions to libraries during this time.

Among those honored was **Elizabeth Crabb**, who has been called the "Johnny Appleseed of Texas Libraries." She was coordinator of the Northeast Texas Library System for 18 years. She was a recipient of major TLA awards and was TLA president from 1982-1983. In 1995 the Elizabeth Crabb Fund was established for legislative advocacy.

Ms. Crabb's daughter, **Beth Crabb**, is a longtime member of FOSAPL and treasurer of the Brook Hollow Branch. Her niece, **Helen McDaniel**, is also a FOSAPL member and treasurer of the McCreless Branch.

## Friends of the San Antonio Public Library Board Meeting Minutes

Sunday, March 26, 2023 | Westfall Branch Library Submitted by Karin Pedersen

Call to Order: John Costello, President, called the meeting to order at 2:01 p.m.

Roll Call: Karin Pedersen, Secretary, advised a quorum was present. John Costello asked each person present to introduce themselves, as many representatives of branch groups were present.

Approval of Minutes as printed in SAPLings March/April 2023 issue. Motion to accept presented by Betty Walters. Motion was seconded by Leslie Cavill-Burns, and all approved.

President's Report: John Costello stated that Iliana Poor has resigned from the post of Online Sales Vendor to return to school, and that a trained volunteer will take over the paid position.

Treasurer's Report: Barbara Morrow stated that the Treasurer's Report has been

streamlined, and the Branch Balances Report has been expanded to include year-to-date tracking of expenditures. The total cash accounts as of Feb. 28 totaled \$273,489.00, with \$150,916.77 designated for the branch accounts and \$122,579.23 available for FOSAPL. A savings CD of \$30K was recently opened, due to mature after 15 months at 4.9% APR.

#### **LIAISON REPORTS**

**Board of Trustees**: Presented by **Josie Martinez**: Trustees are actively preparing for 2024 fiscal budget planning.

Library Administration: Jessica Zurita noted that the Central Library would reopen on April 1.

**Book Cellar** and **Online Sales: John Costello** reported that YTD Online sales net profit was approximately two thousand dollars, and that the BookCellar would be open 10–5 p.m. for Central's reopening day.

*Membership:* Presented by **Barbara Morrow**. Of the 819 current members, 233 have not renewed and will be purged from the database at end of month.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

There was no old business.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Ratification of Board action taken by electronic vote Feb. 15–22, 2023, whereby 19 members voted in favor of approval of the bylaws of the recently reactivated Friends of the Collins Garden Branch Library, and no votes were cast in opposition. Motion so moved by Diane Backhus and seconded by Pat Mendiola. All approved.

Approval of the donation of \$1,400 to SAPL to benefit the Pan American Branch Library (currently lacking an active Friends group), with those funds to be taken from the account of the Friends of the Pan American Branch to support public programming. Motion so moved by Linda Cheatum and seconded by Katie Ferrier. All approved.

Approval of the Task force to conduct the review of 2022 financial records including Ann Springer, Cammie Brantley, Katie Ferrier. Motion so moved by Betty Walters and seconded by Tony Moore. All approved.

#### **ADJOURNMENT**

The meeting was adjourned at 2:17, followed by a focus group facilitated by M. Gómez & Associates.
