

BookCellar Update

Romi Ezzo joined the team in January. Romi came to San Antonio from California where he managed Goodwill's book distribution. His branch shipped 1,000 books per day through e-commerce and listed over 1,200 books per day on various platforms. For

the BookCellar, Romi helps with intake, processing, and shelving. What keeps him with us is the love of books and organizing, which appears to be an endless task. The BookCellar is lucky to welcome Romi and the experience and energy that he brings.

The BookCellar receives ever-fluctuating contributions from libraries and private donations, so "pop-up" sales might be a pleasant surprise when you visit this May and June. During May, sale prices of 50% off will be applied to all Spanish adult and children's books, and writings about outdoor activities such as biking, hiking, field trips, and



sports. Books about the contributions of women will also be on sale. During June, the travel guides, maps, atlases, and vintage books will be available for 50% off.

budget process and ramp up for one of our signature system-wide programs: Summer with SAPL.

With this in mind, I extend an enormous thank you to the Friends of the San Antonio Public Library for approving our location-based donation plans in concert with our location managers. These plans respond to the needs of the individual branches and Texana at the Central Library. These resources help us add to the relevant, interesting, and entertaining programming and services to our community. SAPL's "Online Branch Library" offers services 24/7 from anywhere

Over the past two decades, San Antonio Public Library has built a robust digital library with valuable resources accessible from anywhere via the internet. Like our physical library locations, SAPL's digital library provides a wealth of services and resources to customers. Our digital library services are available 24/7/365 through SAPL's website, MySAPL.org, and a suite of mobile applications.

Through the SAPL website and apps, patrons can sign up for a temporary library card, search the catalog, borrow a book, watch a movie, place holds, renew checkouts, view account details, pay fees, chat with a librarian, or find events to attend. The MySAPL app, available for both Android and iOS, is a great first step to exploring many of the Library's online services. To delve deeper, Libby and Kanopy offer direct access to ebooks, eaudiobooks, and streaming video after a few simple steps to connect these apps to a library card account.

SAPL also offers a variety of online learning opportunities. **Brainfuse** offers live, year-round online tutoring for all ages in nearly every school subject. **Craftsy** delivers thousands of videos on demand for a wide variety of crafts and hobby interests. **Udemy** offers in-depth boot camps on a vast array of topics from technology to business and beyond.

A SAPL card also provides online access to the *New York Times, Wall Street Journal, San Antonio Express-News*, and a large assortment of other news and historical database resources. SAPL's newest app, **Ground News**, allows readers to assess media bias in news stories from multiple publications at the same time.

Every one of these services is free with a SAPL card, and the Library continues to explore and add more services and resources to increase access to informative and entertaining content for library patrons. To get started, simply visit mysapl.org/digital to explore SAPL's dynamic and growing digital branch library.

Saturday, March 24, 2024 | Encino Branch Library Submitted by **Daniel Garza**

Call to Order: John Costello, FOSAPL President, called the meeting to order at 2:01 pm. Roll Call: Presented by Daniel Garza, FOSAPL Secretary. A quorum was present.

Approval of Minutes of the January 27, 2024 meeting: Liz Alves moved to amend the minutes to recognize HEB as the donor for the \$2,000 to each branch library. The motion was seconded, and all in attendance approved.

President's Report: John Costello reported that the Board came together in February for the Board Orientation. It was great to see new and returning Board members. review how the Friends work. and answer any questions. The Orientation was also an opportunity to share the different committees. We welcome and encourage Board participation in these committees as they do important work for the Friends. Finally, while the Library is searching for their new Director, we are pleased and grateful to be working with Interim Library Director Kathy Donellan and Haley Holmes, **PhD** as the interim liaison library administration to FOSAPL.

Treasurer's Report: Barbara Morrow reported that as of February 29, the total cash accounts were \$299,974, which includes \$175,045 as branch designated funds and \$124,928 as FOSAPL funds.

Membership Report: Presented by Acting Membership Secretary **Barbara Morrow**.

As of March 24, there were 770 members, including 545 who have renewed or joined for 2024. That leaves 225 members who need to renew or will be removed from the database at the end of March. There are 175 Life Members, and \$5 for each is sent to their designated branch. Recruit-

ment of a membership Secretary is ongoing.

LIAISON REPORTS

Board of Trustees: In the absence of the Trustees liaison to the Friends, **Josie Martinez**, **Kathy Donellan** reported that **Mary Ann Valdez-Hernandez** is the new Trustee for District 5.

Library Administration: Kathy Donellan:reported that Haley Holmes will be taking over Friends/SAPL liaison duties from Jessica Zurita during the Library Director transition.

In February, a new strategic plan for the library system was approved.

March Board action items: Las Palmas branch bond project – there were revisions to the design and budget that will be reviewed at the Board meeting; Bazan roof project will start in April and will require a closure for 8 weeks.

Two upcoming programs: numerous programs across the Library system for the solar eclipse, including eclipse glasses being available at branches; support of the upcoming Book Festival at Central Library on April 13

The BookCellar will be selling Fiesta medals for the Library and will be splitting proceeds with the Friends. They will be priced at \$10.

Library Foundation: Liaison Liz Alves noted that there is an upcoming Literary Luncheon on May 5 at the Witte Museum Dawson Family Hall, and the event will include Adam Rubin, author of Dragons Love Tacos, Dragons Love Tacos 2, and Dragon's First Taco. Friends who wish to purchase tickets should contact the SAPLF office.
